

T.C. Broadnax Jr. Biographical Information

T.C. Broadnax Jr. began serving as Dallas City Manager on February 1, 2017, bringing a Service First philosophy to the city. Prior to that, he served as City Manager of Tacoma, Washington since 2012, and has more than 25 years of local government management experience. Broadnax is an International City/County Manager's Association Credentialed Manager and is recognized throughout the country for his significant contributions working in the public sector tackling issues relating to community and economic development, neighborhood revitalization, code enforcement, financial management and organizational leadership. His approach to public sector management and community engagement has been instrumental in enhancing the quality of life for the residents of the cities he has served.

Responsible for more than 13,000 employees, Broadnax manages a budget of more than \$4.3 billion with an emphasis on responsible, equitable, accountable, and legitimate financial prudence. Broadnax has brought a transformational leadership approach to the City of Dallas that focuses on normalizing and operationalizing equity. Under his leadership the City adopted its first Racial Equity Plan, Comprehensive Housing Plan, Strategic Economic Development Plan, Strategic Mobility Plan, and Comprehensive Environmental and Climate Action Plan, all guided by the core values of service – Empathy, Ethics, Excellence, Engagement, and Equity.

While serving as City Manager of Tacoma, WA, Broadnax was responsible for an employee workforce of more than 2,200, and a biennial General Government Budget of more than \$1.9 billion. Under his leadership, Tacoma's long-term fiscal health improved. Much of which is credited to his focus on ensuring the City's financial sustainability by increasing transparency and accountability. The City's strong community engagement and solution-driven processes helped citizens better understand budget deficits that were in the millions. He also successfully facilitated a community visioning process that resulted in Tacoma's 10-year strategic plan, Tacoma 2025.

Prior to Tacoma, he served as Assistant City Manager for the City of San Antonio for 5 years, and Assistant City Manager in Pompano, FL for 10 years.

Broadnax earned his bachelor's degrees in Political Science and Communications at Washburn University, in Topeka, KS and a master's degree in Public Administration from the University of North Texas. He is a Kansas native and avid sports enthusiast. He is married and has four children.
